A dog named Sushi was returned to APAC after his daddy had passed away suddenly. Fortunately, we were able to find an immediate foster care home for him and after a few days, he was formally adopted. An interesting development is that although Sushi had a microchip when he was first adopted, the chip could not be found when he was returned to us - even an X-ray could not find it. Although this is uncommon, it can happen occasionally. When you next take your animal to your vet, please ask them to check the microchip is still there and functioning properly.
